Buddhism is a religion which does not have a God at its centre and was founded by an Indian prince, Siddhartha Guatama, who became the Buddha, in the 6 th Century BC when he found enlightenment. It is one of the three signs of being, the others being: Anicca -impermanence. Anatta -no permanent self. Samudaya – origin of unsatisfactoriness, Dukkha is seen as originating in tanha, a craving that can not be satisfied and therefore results in rebirth. Niirodha – The cessation of Dukkha, the overcoming of tanha.

A Buddhist thus aspires to faith in the Triple Gem, that is, the Buddha, the dharma and the sa?gha, as well as the value of discipline. In early Buddhist texts, however, faith does not mean a hostile response or lack of recognition of other deities.
