uveitis by the U.S.

Serious side effects are associated with chronic use of systemic CS; established guidelines recommend the use of steroid-sparing agents if control of uveitis cannot be achieved with 10 mg/day of prednisone (or equivalent) within 3

It ' s important to remember that uveitis is a group of diseases—not one specific disease.
