Example skeleton argument for an employment tribunal hearing A skeleton argument is the Claimant's opportunity to show how the law interacts with the evidence that the tribunal panel has heard. It is important to research the law and in particular to look for relevant precedents (ie case law).

Example skeleton argument for an employment tribunal hearing

A skeleton argument in any form of legal proceeding is a very important document. It is the first opportunity the judge has to evaluate you as an advocate. Whether you are for the appellant or respondent, the skeleton argument should inform the judge which side you are on and (if necessary) who is joining you in representing the appellant or the respondent.

SKELETON ARGUMENT ON BEHALF OF THE DEFENDANT

Skeleton Arguments Skeleton arguments are not expected to be full written arguments, but instead are intended to provide the framework within which oral submissions will be made, and should be as short as the nature of the case permits. In particular they should not be lengthy just because the judgment under appeal is lengthy.
