We propose that Simon's approach to decision making essentially consisted of three main assumptions: first, decisions are not performed by agents with perfect rationality, they are made by agents with bounded rationality; second, the quality of decisions vary as a function of the expertise

Decision Making Process Step # 1. Intelligence Activity: The initial step in the intelligence phase is often referred to as problem finding or problem recognition.

Decision Making Process According to Herbert A. Simon

In his influential book Administrative Behavior (1947), Simon sought to replace the highly simplified classical approach to economic modeling—based on a concept of the single decision-making, profit-maximizing entrepreneur—with an approach that recognized multiple factors that contribute to decision making. According to Simon, this theoretical framework provides a more realistic understanding of a world in which decision making can affect prices and outputs.

Herbert Simon on Decision Making Herbert Simon's most valued contribution to administrative thought is his focus on decision making. He proposed a new concept of administration which is based upon purely factual statements in Administrative science. That is why he calls traditional concept of Administration as proverbs & myths.

What lies at the heart of everything that gets done is decision-making and problem-solving. Problem-solving includes fixing agendas, setting goals and designing actions and decision-making is evaluating and choosing the options thrown up by problem-solving actions.

In decision-making, Simon believed that agents face uncertainty about the future and costs in acquiring information in the present. These factors limit the extent to which agents may make a fully rational decision, thus they possess only " bounded rationality " and must make decisions by " satisficing ", or choosing that which might not be optimal, but which will make them happy enough.

Herbert Simon, in fact, is the pioneer in the field of decision-making concept because he felt that if decision were not taken properly and timely that may spoil the objective of the business organisation and keeping this in mind it is essential that an organisation will resort to utmost caution as to the adoption of decision and at the same time will focus on the implementation of the decision.

According to (Simon 1960) and his later work with (Newell 1972), decision-making is a process with distinct stages. He suggested for the first time the decision-making model of human beings. His model of decision-making has three stages: • Intelligence which deals with the problem identification and the data collection on the problem.
