It is a slip skin variety, meaning that the skin separates easily from the fruit. The grapes are used to make wine, most notably Uhudler and Fragolino. The Isabella being of the genus Vitis x Labruscana imparts a " foxiness " to the wine and because of this is thought to be objectionable, therefore it is not seen as a grape capable of ...

The exact origins of the variety remain unclear, but it is thought to have occurred naturally when European grapes were first propagated in North America. The name Isabella was given to the variety in 1816 when it was discovered in Dorchester, South Carolina, by Brooklyn nursery owner, William Price.

The origins of Isabella grape, a native Vitis Labrusca, are still unknown. Perhaps it originated in the Carolinas by random pollination of a labrusca grape and an unknown vinifera.
