The Taiping rebels denounced the divine pretensions of the imperial title and the sacred character of the imperial office as blasphemous usurpations of Shangdi's title and position. In place of the imperial institution, the rebels called for restoration of the classical system of kingship. Previous rebellions had declared their contemporary dynasties corrupt and therefore in need of revival; the Taiping, by contrast, branded the entire imperial order blasphemous and in need of replacement.

The Northern Expedition (Chinese: ?????) was a failed campaign by the Taiping Heavenly Kingdom against the Qing dynasty during the Taiping Rebellion.Its purpose was to capture Beijing and then complete an encirclement of northern and western China.Launched in May 1853, the Northern Expedition would travel from Jiangsu to Zhili before being destroyed in early 1855.
