At the end of your paper, you'll likely include a bibliography (for notes and bibliography style) or a reference list (for author-date). Bibliographies and reference lists are not double-spaced, but leave a blank line between entries. If an entry extends onto a second line, a ½ inch indent should be applied to all but the first line of the entry.
